1.1 Hampshire to win the SCC (Senior County Championships).	 Increased provision of singles training and competition. Introduction of a singles 'ladder' to become a weekly feature of Hampshire senior squad training. Introduce more junior aged players into the 3rd and 4th teams to make places in the 1st and 2nd teams more competitive. Player availability and fitness (injury avoidance). Personalised fitness programmes for some players and regular assessment of fitness levels 					
	of top two teams. Stricter controls over attendance to doubles training to ensure valuable use of the 2.5 hours.					
1.2 For at least one team to qualify for the Shires League Finals.	 More juniors to train alongside the seniors to 'sharpen' their game. Greater consistency of county training so that future events are planned into the training calendar and additional venues sought when and where necessary. Two teams in the U18 league to reflect the strength and depth Hampshire has in that particular age group. 					





	As many juniors to attend training as possible so that the best players in the county can train alongside each other.		
	Expectation for juniors to work on their fitness levels in their own time so as to maximise the use of court time during training sessions.		
1.3 U18s to finish in the top 4 at the U18 ICT.	Have two team in the U18s and to maximise the level of competition those players all receive.		
	Ensure the top U18s are all training within the county structure when and where possible so that the best players and partnerships can be assessed.

2.1 To develop a successful series of 'grassroots' junior badminton events for noncounty level players in Hampshire.	 Design a two-tier structure which allows juniors aged between 8 and 18 years to compete locally. Use of BE Tournament Planner to make the process of entering the events easy and straight forward. Increased BE membership as a consequence of use of TP for tournament entries. 					
	 Development of a 'league' system which records results and allocates points to players thus ensuring players will return and return. Use as a way of talent identification within the region, not just Hampshire (attract players from adjoining counties). 					
2.2 To produce and maintain a high quality HBA website with up-to-date and useful information and guidance.	 Design the structure of a website which is informative and updated on a regular basis. Hampshire clubs will be given the opportunity to use this as a means of advertising their own 					
	respective clubs and producing updates relevant to their own members. Masters information and					
	results/match reports will inform players at all levels. Make the second of the Hampshire Badminton

	Increased use of social media to promote badminton throughout the county and beyond.

2.3 Create a successful badminton 'Leadership Academy' in Hampshire which provides players of all ages with the basic skills of officiating the game.	Westgate to become a designated leadership centre providing and delivering leadership to players of all ages.
